WHY WE SHOULD SAY, "NO!" TO OUR CHILDREN

The time of Lent can be equated to pruning a rose bush. It is hard work to cut through thick thorny branches. We know we are going to get scratched and pricked and will probably get dirty and itchy in the process. However, once the rose bush is pruned, it looks neat and ready to rest for winter. Our true reward happens in spring when the plant starts budding vibrant green shoots and then starts blooming its sweetly-scented, beautiful roses.

Lent is hard. It is a time to say, "No," to ourselves and, "Yes," to God. Giving up eating rich and delicious food and partaking in blander, non-indulgent meals. It's a time to ensure that we don't behave recklessly, but rather think twice about how we speak to and behave towards others. This is a time when we shouldn't be extravagantly purchasing items for ourselves, but rather giving alms to help those who are less fortunate.

Our girls often give up chocolates, sweets, fizzy cold drinks and other treats during Lent and this is certainly appropriate. However, there is a lot more, that we can do as parents, to help them to learn the true value of Lent and this is by saying, "No."

Psychologists have discovered that children have recognised that if they nag for long enough, their parents will give in to their demands. Be that demand a request for a playdate, a treat or toy, a new pet or a fancy holiday; we equate giving with love, and see the meeting of the request as a sign of our love for our children. So how does this correspond with the season of Lent? We can use this valuable time to do a bit of pruning – to clip back those straggly branches and awkward shoots. Use this time of Lent to help your children to learn the value of the word, "No!"

The following has been taken from an article by Taylor Cleland and includes advice by acclaimed parenting guru and author, Betsy Brown Braun:

One of the toughest things for me, as a parent, is having to endure the wrath of my children when they don't get what they want. Just saying the word, "No!" to my kids, can turn a perfectly wonderful afternoon into a nightmare. As a result, I'm often tempted to give in just to restore the peace. But is this the best approach?

Children are trying to figure out the extent of their parameters – What are the rules of the road? What is okay and what is not okay? Does, "No," sometimes mean, "Yes?" They can't figure it out unless there are clear boundaries. So, one reason that we say, "No," is so that the child will learn. There are 3 peaks which all children have to scale, in order to grow up and function in the world and often they involve hearing the word, "No!"

- Tolerating disappointment

- Tolerating frustration
- Delaying gratification

Learning these life skills, will not happen if the child always gets what he wants. In order to tolerate [frustration](#), you have to be frustrated, so [as a parent] you have to give the, “No,” response, however we say it, in order to teach the child to tolerate disappointment.

But, there are times when it’s just exhausting to say, “No.” Can’t we give in ‘just this once?’ Sometimes for the parent, it’s just easier to avoid conflict by giving in or doing what the child wants. Their precious time together will be more pleasant. This thinking is short sighted. **What kind of attributes are we cultivating in our children by always caving in to their demands?**

Children who aren’t given clear boundaries or ones who always get what they want are those who often have trouble playing nicely with others; they have a hard time socialising because they have never experienced being anything but “queen”. They have a hard time keeping friends, a hard time interacting in groups and a hard time taking turns. They seldom know how to delay [gratification](#); they want what they want when they want it, and they have a tough time in the world, interacting with others. The real world is not going to give them just what they want all the time or even most of the time. Their world is then full of disappointment, and they blame it on everyone else, not taking any responsibility themselves. These children aren’t able to look into themselves and say, ‘Gosh, this is happening because I wasn’t helpful or I didn’t give her a turn.’ They often see the world as being against them. A person’s ability to socialise, to interact with others co-operatively, to be part of a team, to be both leader and follower, all grow out of his having learned to accept [boundaries](#) and to tolerate the frustrations that result from other’s needs and wants, in addition to his own, that he will no doubt encounter.

So in light of this advice, use this difficult season of Lent to teach your child valuable life lessons just by using the word, “No,” and enjoy the beautiful precious rose that blooms as a result of your pruning

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
